A New Constitutional Question

Digital disruption → constitutional implications

- From individual expression to systemic conditions for free speech
- EU moves from soft law to binding regulation
- A new paradigm of freedom of thought is emerging

Core issue: How far can EU law shape the democratic public sphere?









The Regulatory Shift

From voluntary measures to enforceable obligations:

- Digital Services Act→ Platforms must manage risks to civic discourse, elections, rights
- Political Advertising Regulation
 — Common rules for transparency; bans sensitive-data micro-targeting
- Media Freedom Act
 → Protects journalists; limits state control over public media

Key point: EU legislation now enters constitutional domains of Member States









Constitutional Spillover & Dual Logic

- Spillover effect: market laws reshape national rights frameworks
- Technocratic risks: rights as tools for regulation, not ends in themselves
- Converging rationales:
 - rights protection
 - market integration

Subsidiarity and national parliamentary autonomy under strain









Towards a New Paradigm

- Freedom of thought: structural & supranational
- From negative liberty to positive duty to ensure pluralism
- Need for constitutional legitimacy, not only legal authority

Conclusion Remarks

- Hybrid threats require stronger democracy, not less;
- The EU must evolve with constitutional principles.
